SCIENCE - Sr. Rania

From studying about matter and Periodic table, the 8th graders moved towards particle motion in different states of matter and finally to energy and its transformations. They analyzed motion of gas particles when thermal energy is applied through activities based on online simulations and arrived at gas laws (Boyle and Charles law). They analyzed motion of liquid particles during the reaction with dye tablets in different temperatures. They then calculated the speed of water molecules through the data collected during the experiment and compared it to the speed of a car. Currently, they are studying energy transformations in different systems. They developed an argument for a safe design of a roller coaster applying concepts of kinetic and potential energy. They would be exploring springs, pendulums and modelling "spoolwheeled cars" using all the related concepts.





SOCIAL STUDIES - Sr. Shaima

Students learned about the importance of water in Georgia's historical development and its economic growth they analyzed Brunswick, and Savannah Ports. They located and labeled the different regions and water bodies of Georgia.


MATH - Sr. Anam
